# **Giving It All Away**

On November 4, Dinkey held its annual Election Day Spaghetti Dinner. Some of the faces helping with the dinner changed, but it was still the same fantastic salad bar, great selection of sauces, and wide variety of desserts. There were even many familiar faces that support the dinner year in and year out. Yet there was one big difference from previous spaghetti dinners.

This year, the profits from the dinner would go to VALOR (Veterans Assisted Living Out Reach). VALOR Clinic Foundation is a nonprofit organization committed to improving access to quality of healthcare and shelter of veterans. Their office is located at "Paul's House" in Kunkletown at the Old Jonas Hotel.

The difference isn't that profits are going to VALOR; every year donations are made to different organizations. The big difference this year is that <u>all</u> the profits are going to VALOR. This is the first time that I or anyone else can remember that everything is being given away to a ministry outside the congregation — which brings me a great deal of joy!

A check for \$2163.13 will be presented to VALOR to support the work they do with veterans. This is possible all because people were willing to donate their time, efforts, and resources. What makes this even cooler is that this wasn't a solo venture.

Last year, and again this year, St. John's, Mahoning provided the meatballs and members volunteered to help with the setup, serving, and clean up. When St. John's council heard all the profits were going to VALOR, there was no hesitation, they were going to donate all the meatballs for the dinner. And trust me, they made a lot of meatballs!

When Dinkey and St. John's entered into the Purchase of Service Agreement over 3 years ago now, the reasons were that there aren't enough pastors and neither congregation was positioned financially to support a fulltime pastor on their own. As a result of these two congregations working together, we are able to partake in outreach ministry like the spaghetti dinner and let that light of Christ shine. This is why we agreed to work together, not to keep the doors of each congregation open, but to share the love of God with the community and beyond. Thank you all for your commitment to living out our calling as the people of God! You are an inspiration to me!






