

## **Extra! Extra! Read all about it!**

It is amazing how quickly information can be shared today. If there is something taking place on the other side of the world I can hear about it in real time. News spreads fast but it hasn't always worked that way.

Originally, if you wanted to tell someone something you had to go directly to them and share the information, or you could send someone to share the information for you. To speed things up a person could use a horse. Then there will carrier pigeons. The telegraph was an enormous leap, follow by radios and television. Now with cell phones and the internet we can be in touch with anyone anywhere in the world instantaneously. But what about when it comes to sharing God's good news?

The Bible itself is a means to share information of God's love for God's people because within its pages are story after story demonstrating that love. There were times God communicated directly with people, through dreams and visions, and through acts of nature. But there were also times God sent angels. The Greek word for angel is *angelos* and literally means *messenger*. These messengers varied in their appearance and power, but all invariably communicated God's word to the people.

Today we communicate and share God's word through a variety of ways. Bible studies, worship services, bulletin announcements, personal interactions, newsletters, and online resources are some of the ways we share how God's word is active among us to share love and hope. You're reading this right now because someone has taken the time to assemble this newsletter (and pester me for my article).

We can share what is taking place within our congregation, neighboring congregations, our community, and even the wider church. I would like to share with you another means by which information about the wider church is being shared. The NEPA Synod publishes a Weekly E-News sharing things taking place within our synod and across the ELCA. I encourage you to sign up by visiting the synod's website at <https://nepasynod.org/e-news/>. Then in addition to our newsletters and announcements you can encounter many of the other voices that are messengers of God's love and grace all around us. Let's hear that good news and continue to be messengers of that love ourselves.
